Who should create the commissioning specs? Shouldn't the commissioning agent be responsible for these to properly align with their contract?

Ideally, the architect-engineer should be developing these specifications and you'll review, comment and mark it up. That takes a lot of time and coordination, so as a commissioning agent, we have a good ol' handy-dandy spec that we like best. We're going to ask the architect-engineer to use that version because there's a lot less editing. The architect-engineer owns it; it's their manual that they're going to stamp and certify so they have to believe in the material within it, even though you provided it to them. There needs to be a level of coordination. You're really just trying to cut to the chase; do you want to red-line every line-item to make it look like yours, or do you want to just give them one to make it a little easier.





The prerecorded, 3-hour commissioning workshop will cover all aspects of commissioning ranging from project management to functional testing, and both new and existing building commissioning.
